Section 4: First-Aid Measures

- Inhalation: Remove victim to fresh air and keep at rest in a position comfortable for breathing. Section 6: Accidental Release Measures

• Personal Precautions, Protective Equipment and Emergency Procedures

• Methods and Materials for Containment and Cleaning Up

Spill: Stop leak if without risk. Move containers from spill area. Approach release from upwind. Prevent entry into sewers, water courses, basements or confined areas. Wash spillages into an effluent treatment plant or proceed as follows. Contain and collect spillage with non-combustible, absorbent material e.g. sand, earth, vermiculite or diatomaceous earth and place in container for disposal according to local regulations (see Section 13). Dispose of via a licensed waste disposal contractor. Contaminated absorbent material may pose the same hazard as the spilled product. Note: see Section 1 for emergency contact information and Section 13 for waste disposal.

Section 7: Handling and Storage

• Precautions for Safe Handling

o **Protective Measures:** Put on appropriate personal protective equipment (see Section 8). Do not ingest. Avoid contact with eyes, skin and clothing. Avoid breathing vapor or mist. Keep in the original container or an approved alternative

made from a compatible material, kept tightly closed when not in use. Empty containers retain product residue and can be hazardous. Do not reuse container.

• Advice on General:

Section 10: Stability and Reactivity

- Stability: This product is stable up to 110°C (230°F)
- **Conditions to Avoid**: Do not heat above 110°C as this will result in an exothermic decomposition with rapid release of CO2 gas and potentially hydrofluoric acid.
- Incompatible Materials: Reactive or incompatible with the following materials: oxidizers. This material may be extremely hazardous in contact with chlorates and nitrates. Contact with hypochlorites (eg. Chlorine bleach, sulfides or cyanides) will liberate toxic gases. Do not store in containers that have aluminum or zinc content. However, product can be used for smaller periods of time to clean various metals. Contact with alkaline materials (eg. Aqua ammonia) will generate heat and may produce noxious gas. Do not mix directly with dehydrating agents such as acetic anhydride or concentrated sulfuric acid. High concentrations of AC Coil Cleaner Concentrate will react vigorously with carbonate scales which may carry vapor and so care must be taken to avoid inhalation.
